fully scenicked. Unique to this layout are the beautiful river scenes. VJ tower, pictured here, is where the Mountain branch crosses the B&O Mainline. The powerhouse on the left is supplied with coal from the Mountain Branch. The Mountain Branch crosses the two bridges seen in the background in its climb up to Megantown.
